What is the History of Southwest Chula Vista?

What happened?

1. Council voted to not allow marijuana dispensaries in the city, but to allow existing delivery service and caregivers providing to patients who had doctor's prescriptions.
2. The Council passed a balanced budget before June 30 as required by law. Extra money was given to the libraries so that they will be open 7 days a week starting August. Also there will be a storefront library opening in Otay Ranch Town center with longer hours soon to replace the one at Eastlake school. The Recreation Dept. also got enough funding to open the Recreation Centers more than two days per week. They were able to open more during the school holiday due to donations from the Friends group. They will however have to increase fees for use of fields and parks. Norman Park Center will also be open more hours. Senior Unity has been actively fund raising. Public works budget has been further reduced, which will effect maintenance of all public resources.
- 3 Superintendent Gandara of SUHSD was fired with a large severance package.
4. Nick Aguilar resigned from the board of Southwestern College. A replacement will be chosen by the board by the end of the month. If interested now is the time to apply.

What will happen?

1. A weekly farmer's market at Swiss Park at the end of Main St. from 3-7 is held every Monday.
2. On Wednesday July 20 there will be a presentation by a professional historian about the history of Chula Vista from 6PM to 7:30PM at the Civic Center Library at F and 4th.
3. On Wednesday July 27 The Southwest Working Group will meet and discuss zoning changes for the area between Palomar, Anita, Frontage and Industrial,
