What is the History of Southwest Chula Vista?

What happened this month?

1. Wed. 4/20 6:30Pm in the Civic Library an excellent presentation on the history of Chula Vista in the 30's and 40's.
2. The Council agreed to start implementing Climate Adaptation Strategies as funds become available. Also they delayed laying off 4 police officers
3. The RCC agreed with changes to General Plan & Codes that will keep all power plants 1,000 feet from residents in CV.

What will happen?

1. On Wednesday the 18th at The Woman's Club at 375 G Street The council Public Safety Committee will meet and discuss the **Medical Marijuana Dispensary** situation, since the moratorium will end on June 21.
2. On Saturday May 21 at 8AM a 5K walk/run will be held at the Olympic Training Center. The \$25 fee will benefit Chula Vista.
3. On Wednesday May 25 The Southwest Working Group will meet and discuss zoning changes for the area between Palomar, Anita, Frontage and Industrial, and Walnut and Trenton Sts.

Call to order at 6:20 with total attendees: 18

1. Motion to approve minutes of March 28 made by Richard, 2nd by Bettie, approved.
2. Announcement of effort to bring a SWC campus to Southwest made and motion to support made by Steve, 2nd by Jerry and approved unanimously.

3. Introduction of guest Jose Mireles representing South Bay Community Services. A community and child development team started in 1971 as "Our House" on 3rd Ave. Discussion included:

A. With funding from local, state and private donors their stated goal is to help families and youth reach their potential by providing respectful services.

B. Providing aid to homeless families and some individuals by a partnership with other agencies. After a needs assessment they may issue vouchers for hotel rooms for up to 28 days at \$50 a night. Homeless count in Chula Vista is 441 and some refuse to accept any aid.

4. Introduction of guest Rosemary Johnson representing Interfaith Shelter Network on the subject of meals and shelter for the homeless.

A. 10 congregations team to provide 2 weeks of meals and shelter to families and some individuals. They provide the only winter shelter in the South Bay.

B. Good conduct required but no drug or alcohol testing. Services provided from Nov. to April with 2 of every 5 homeless contacted not wishing assistance.

5. Adjourn at 7:50

One Day Homeless Count in Jan. of 2011 found in Chula Vista: 36 people in emergency shelters (hotel rooms), 171 in transitional housing (families & teens, managed by Southbay Community Services), 234 unsheltered (on the streets). C.V. had the highest number of unsheltered homeless after San Diego, which has 67.5% (3,369) of all the homeless in the county compared to C.V. 5% (441)
